Regina Baumhauer has received numerous awards and scholarships, including the Wettbewerb Ostwürttemberg für Malerei, the Preis der Dietenberger-Mahringer Stiftung, an award of the Rotary Foundation, an award of the competition "Kunst für Brüssel," an award of the Innovationsfonds Kunst Baden-Württemberg, and YADDO. At the residency at Saratoga Springs, New York, she developed important parts of her artistic vocabulary of the ongoing "Open Letter Series," which also includes our cover image. The richly textured canvases of this series, developed through graphite, acrylics and embroidery, invite the eye and the mind of the viewer to explore.
